WORSHIP

Lord, you are my God; I will exalt you and praise your name, for in perfect faithfulness you have done wonderful things. - Isaiah 25:1

Worship and Music Committee cares about all things related to worship and music. We are truly blessed with over 150 different people who help lead worship. "To gather with God's people in united adoration of the Father is as necessary to the Christian life as prayer." – Martin Luther

Altar Guild prepares the church for worship. This includes caring for the altar area, setting up for communion and baptisms, ordering supplies, and changing the seasonal paraments. The Altar guild orders the flowers for Sunday services and does special decorating for the seasons of Christmas and Easter.

Acolytes assist with worship by lighting the candles, giving offering plates, and other things as needed.

Bells of Praise Ring! Ding! Ding! This handbell ensemble meets from September to May and rehearses on Thursday evenings. The group plays for worship once a month, participates in Bellfest and attends an August ringing workshop.

Cantors lead the congregation in our sung liturgy, which is the work of the people. Training is provided.

Children and Youth Choir sings in worship about once a month and rehearses Wednesday nights from September to May.

Choir sings choral music from a variety of time periods and traditions including global songs, chants, classical works, Lutheran chorales, motets, and 20th century sacred compositions. Season is from September to May primarily Sundays 8:30 AM.

Communion Servers are all ages. Communion is offered at every Sunday Worship. We serve by intinction and once a month at the altar rail.

Festival Choir gathers for special services such as Thanksgiving Eve, Christmas Eve, Holy Week, Easter, and Music Sunday. This is a great opportunity for those who like to sing but are unable to make a nine-month commitment.

Greeters offer a warm welcome to all who come to worship. They are the embodiment of Psalm 118:24, "This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it."

Jubilee Worship Team leads our contemporary worship, primarily at 10:00 Sunday mornings. The group also plays and sings for special events including outdoor worship and the Mall of America Holiday Music Festival.

Lector Ministry helps us hear the Scriptures from a variety of voices. By reading the Scriptures in worship, the lectors show us that the Bible is accessible to all and meant for all of us - just like the grace of God.

NEW - Live Stream Worship Host to welcome and engage people who join St. Luke's worship online. Trained and supported by the Director of Online Worship and Social Media.

Special Music enhances worship, from brass ensemble and other instrumentalists to vocalists. All who are interested are welcome.

Ushers wear many hats at St. Luke's. They serve as greeters and guides while also covering security and first aid needs as they arise. A training is held in January to review duties and receive new information about updated procedures on securing the building. They are always learning and caring for members and friends of St. Luke's.

Audio, Camera and Video Techs volunteer their time helping everyone can participate in worship, in person or online. No experience needed, training is available.

Welcome Desk is part of the Community Life Team and a vital part of worship. If anyone has a question, this is the perfect place to bring them.

Worship Assistants They lead spoken and sung liturgy and prayers, and assist with offering and communion as needed. All ages are welcome with training provided.

EVANGELISM

Every Member is a Minister – Our welcome is lived out in sharing our space with outside groups, caring for our grounds and facilities, and greeting everyone inside and outside of church with the radical hospitality of Jesus. In doing so we are keeping the commandment to “love our neighbor as ourselves.” This is evangelism.

All In - A training that enhances your relational skills to reach out, care, and welcome in everyday, everywhere relationships. It is an adult version of Peer Ministry. Every member is a minister.

NEW – Community Engagement Team getting to know the needs and opportunities for St. Luke’s to invite neighbors and partner with other organizations. Training and support provided by the Director of Community Engagement.

Garden and Island Care Club – Join others in caring for our gardens and parking lot islands. How we care for the outside speaks to how we care for people inside.

Funeral and Wedding Ministry provides hospitality to those celebrating special life events. The Team members take turns helping when able.

Heritage Days Parade – Taking evangelism to the streets – literally. Join other members sharing our love of Jesus one bag of fruit snacks at a time. This year we are creating a new theme which means building a new float. Join the fun and festivities.

Outdoor Playground Care and Clean Up. Both the St. Luke’s Preschool and Learning Tree Development Center use the playground during the week. It is also a wonderful way to meet the neighbors.

Property Team – This team saves thousands of dollars by doing service that would otherwise need to be contracted out.

Snow Shovelers – Help clear the way for the Preschool and Childcare Centers, Monday-Friday by 7 AM.

Trunk or Treat is a bridge event. Both members of St. Luke's and members of the community decorate their cars/trunks and pass out candy to the trick or treaters. Community Life Team - Though society might tell us that we can do life on our own, God's word tells us that we simply can't function without each other (1 Corinthians 12). We need each other and we need community, friends in Christ. All are Welcome!

Bunco is a dice game that meets monthly during the school year. This is a great way to have fun and meet new people. The game requires us to change tables, getting the chance to play with everyone.

Card Ministry Team meets at Church the 2nd Monday at 1 PM. The Care Team prints the address labels. About 40 cards are sent out to the home-bound or ill members. The team hand writes a personal message to each, signs their own name, and the Church mails them.

Care Team serves our homebound, sick, or members going through a crisis. Members of this ministry make phone calls and visit, and distribute communion to those who are unable to attend church. Contact is made once a month, every other month, or when it works best for the person. The smiles and hugs received from these members is the most wonderful part of this ministry and tells the story of how important it is to keep everyone connected to St. Luke's no matter what their circumstance.

Dishwashing Team is helping St. Luke's go green. People are needed Sunday mornings, Wednesday Night Meals, Funerals, and other events. No experience necessary. Training provided.

Fall Fellowship happens on the Wednesday of MEA in October. Campfire, food, and games make for a delightful evening.

Koffee Korner is open to all ages of adults. We meet for an hour on Thursdays at 9:30 A.M. for a good cup of coffee. We have a lot of laughs and, personally, I have yet to ask for advice or information on any subject that someone is not more than willing to share a like situation and remedy.

Men's Golf Team - Monday afternoons, May to September at Lost Spur Golf Course.

Men's Softball Team is all about fellowship and community building. Our team has been playing since 1988 against the same Church teams for years.

Prayer Team lifts up the prayers requested by the community and follows up as we are able. No experience necessary.

Sailing Ministry – Experience the transformation that occurs when you let the wind move you. The word for wind in Hebrew and Greek can also be translated as Spirit. St. Luke's invites you to enjoy time on the water of Lake Superior, sailing around and exploring the Apostle Islands. There is a High School Graduate Trip in the summer and an Adult trip in the fall.

Sunday Hosts sets up the coffee, water, and treats prior to the 8:30 worship and cleans up after the 10 am. Partners work great with one sets the other cleans.

Sunday Treats are provided by members each week. Schedule if flexible. Homemade and/or store bought. It's easier to connect while enjoying a beverage and treat.

Vacations with a Purpose – St. Luke's has participated in recent trips to the Holy Lands and Greece. Along with adult trips, know that St. Luke's has a congregational approach to Youth Ministries. Adults are invited to be leaders on retreats, ski trips, sailing, and especially the summer mission trips. Sign up to be contacted for either or both of these adventures.

Wednesday Night Meal – A great combination of good food and faithful friends. Meal is from 5:30-6:00 PM in Fellowship Hall. Teams have a 5-week rotation. Cost is \$3, with those 5 and under Free.

Young Adult Group - Our Young Adult Ministry is geared toward people 21 to 29 years olds looking for fellowship with other Christian young adults, a place to learn and discuss spiritual and real world topics that are relevant to their lives. All are welcome to join this community, no matter where in their spiritual journey.

STEWARDSHIP

Stewardship Team seeks to lead members into spiritual formation that allows us to trust God, to serve God, and enjoy God with all we are and all we have. This is not just about money, it includes giving time and sharing talents. Below are ways for you to strengthen the church and your own life.

Attendance Entry is helpful in caring for our members. It allows us to follow up with those we have not heard or seen. Thank you to those who complete a Welcome Card and share it during offering.

Bulletin Production is a very time consuming project, especially for the Easter and Christmas worships.

Care of the Earth is a new group that is helping St. Luke's be good stewards. Recently St. Luke's had an energy audit. It will take a small team to help the building be more efficient.

Office Volunteer – Assist with projects, mailings, the phone, and greet those who come to the office. Be on call or have a set schedule.

St. Luke's Foundation was established in 1994 as a Minnesota Corporation. It is a qualifying charitable organization under IRS 501 (c)3 regulations. The Foundation is a separate corporation within St. Luke's Lutheran Church. The Foundation operates under its own set of by-laws and all active, confirmed members of St. Luke's Lutheran Church, as defined by the Congregational Constitution. The Foundation Board of Directors consists of five members who respond to grant requests to enhance St. Luke's ministries and facilities, which recently included staff enrichment and computer upgrades. There is also a **PHASE Fund** specifically for youth providing scholarships and funding special activities such as Camp and the Mission Trip.

Teller Ministry works in pairs, rotating weeks. The tellers process the offering collections. They separate the yellow welcome cards, count the money, and prepare the weekly bank deposit. Their work ensures members' donations are properly recorded and money is deposited into the bank in a timely fashion.

Faith Formation Team – We believe that our faith is formed, and re-formed, through our entire lives. Faith Formation begins at birth, and is nourished by the family, with the assistance and support of the congregation and church leadership. At St. Luke's, you'll find Faith Formation activities for all ages.

Milestone Ministry - all ages!

A faith milestone is a marker along life's journey that says, "This is something important and God is here, too." Marking a milestone is a biblically-based spiritual practice, in both home and congregation that helps all generations recognize God's presence in all of life. Special activities and classes or 'milestones' are offered for each age/grade level throughout the year.

SUNDAY MORNINGS – YEAR ROUND

Nursery is for a when child needs a little more wiggle room. Parents are invited to stay with their child and are welcome to use the nursery during any services.

Prayground invites the littlest among us to experience worship up front in a space designed especially for them. Soft toys, books, and more are available, along with a Prayground attendant to help engage them.

Activity Bags filled with crayons, coloring pages, and books are available in the Narthex and outside the door by the pulpit. Children are invited to keep busy seated in the pew. Sign up to clean and replenish bags.

Children's Time is for children in the front of the sanctuary to hear a message specifically geared for them – the rest of the congregation often participates

Children's Church is for early, middle and late childhood and beyond. We believe children have an innate sense of the presence of God. The Godly Play approach helps them to explore their faith through story, to gain religious language and to enhance their spiritual experience through wonder and play. It is based on Montessori principles and, develops over time, using a spiral curriculum. This takes place during the Word part of the worship; readings, message, Creed, and prayers.

Sunday Senior High Brunch for 9th-12th grade students enjoy a meal once a month includes a devotion and time to plan other activities. 11:15 AM -12:30 PM.

Preschooler and Parent Ministry (6-6:30 PM) Guided activities and play help to foster friendships between the children and the parents.

Early Elementary Ministry (6-7:00 PM) Kindergarten through 2nd Grade children enjoy building relationships, and studying the Bible through fun and creative way to learn.

Children's Ministry (6-7:00 PM) Third - Fifth Grade students begin to integrate their faith and life, through the Bible, Service, and Ministry opportunities.

NEW! – Children Pick up (7-7:15 PM) Early Elementary and Children's Ministry have free play in the Children's Ministry room, where they can be found for pick up.

Confirmation (6-7:15 PM) 6th-7th grade rotate between learning the Bible one year and the Small Catechism the next. 8th grade learns Peer Ministry.

Peer Ministry (6-7:15 PM) 8th- 12th grade students learn how to listen and care for their peers. It ends the year preparing to be a Peer Leader with Children's Ministry or Confirmation.

Adult Education (6-7 PM) Topical Studies from September – December. January – April is a Bible study following the Narrative Lectionary which is the Gospel of John in 2022.

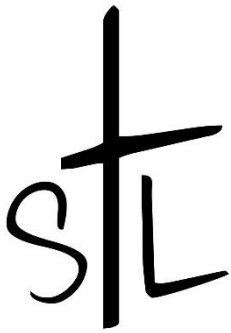
