Opening Prayer

First Reading: **Jeremiah 17:14-17**

Heal me, O LORD, and I shall be healed; save me, and I shall be saved; for you are my praise. See how they say to me, "Where is the word of the LORD? Let it come!" But I have not run away from being a shepherd in your service, nor have I desired the fatal day. You know what came from my lips; it was before your face. Do not become a terror to me; you are my refuge in the day of disaster;

L: The word of the Lord

C: Thanks be to God.

Gospel Reading: **Matthew 8:1-4**

When Jesus had come down from the mountain, great crowds followed him; and there was a leper who came to him and knelt before him, saying, "Lord, if you choose, you can make me clean." He stretched out his hand and touched him, saying, "I do choose. Be made clean!" Immediately his leprosy was cleansed. Then Jesus said to him, "See that you say nothing to anyone; but go, show yourself to the priest, and offer the gift that Moses commanded, as a testimony to them."

C: Hear us, and make us whole.
