WORSHIP

Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple,

Worship and Music Committee cares about all things related to worship and music. We are truly blessed with over 100 different people who serve in worship and more are welcome. "To gather with God's people in united adoration of the Father is as necessary to the Christian life as prayer." – Martin Luther

Altar Guild prepares the church for worship. The guild cares for the altar area, sets up for communion and baptisms, orders supplies, and changes the seasonal paraments. The Altar guild is responsible for the flowers for Sunday worship and decorating for the seasons.

Acolytes assist with worship by lighting the candles and other things as needed.

Bells of Praise The hand bell ensemble meets from September to May, rehearsing on Thursday evenings. The group plays for worship monthly.

Cantors lead the congregation in our sung liturgy, which is the work of the people. Training is provided.

Choir sings a variety of choral music from chants to 20th century sacred compositions. Season is from September to May at 8:30 AM worship.

Communion Servers are all ages. Communion is offered at every first and third Sunday at the altar rail.

Festival Choir invites others who do not normally sing in the Choir at 8:30 AM worship to join them Easter, Christmas, and other special occasions.

Greeters offer a warm welcome to all who come to worship. They are the embodiment of Psalm 118:24, "This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it."



Jubilee Worship Team leads our 10:00 AM praise and worship all year long.

Lector Ministry reads the Scriptures in worship demonstrating that the Bible is accessible to all and meant for all of us - just like the grace of God.

Live Stream Worship Host welcomes and engages people who join St. Luke's worship online. Training is available and supported by the Director of Online Worship and Social Media.

Special Music enhances worship, from brass ensemble and other instrumentalists to vocalists. All who are interested are welcome.

Ushers wear many hats at St. Luke's. They serve as greeters and guides while also covering security and first aid needs. Training is held to review duties and receive new information about updated procedures. They are always learning and caring for members and friends of St. Luke's.

Sound, Camera and Video Techs volunteer their time helping everyone participate in worship, whether in person or online. Sunday mornings, special worship, funerals... No experience needed; training is provided.

Welcome Desk is part of the Community Life Team and a vital part of worship. If anyone has a question, this is the perfect place to ask.

Worship Assistants lead spoken liturgy, prayers, and assist with communion as needed. All ages are welcome. Training provided.

EVANGELISM

...having the goodwill of all the people

Every Member is a Minister – Our welcome is lived out in sharing our space with outside groups, caring for our grounds and facilities, and greeting everyone inside and outside of church with the radical hospitality of Jesus. In doing so we are keeping the commandment to “love our neighbor as ourselves.” This is evangelism.

All In - A training that enhances your relational skills to reach out, care, and welcome in everyday, everywhere relationships. It is an adult version of Peer Ministry. Every member is a minister.

NEW – Faith Practices and Neighboring Practices is a Lilly Funded Minneapolis Synod initiative 2023-25 helping congregations connect with their surrounding community. For those interested in helping St. Luke’s reach out beyond our walls.

Garden and Island Care Club – Join others in caring for our gardens and parking lot islands. How we care for the outside speaks to how we care for people inside.

Funeral and Wedding Ministry provides hospitality to those commemorating special life events.

Heritage Days Parade – Taking evangelism to the streets – literally. Join other members sharing our love of Jesus one bag of fruit snacks at a time.

Outdoor Playground Care and Clean Up. Both the St. Luke’s Preschool and Learning Tree Development Center use the playground during the week. It is also a wonderful way to meet the neighbors.

Property Team – This team saves thousands of dollars by doing service that would otherwise need to be contracted out. Tasks performed include: temperature setting for our zoned heating/cooling, maintenance of the HVAC systems, interior light bulb replacement, automated and emergency equipment testing and battery replacement: lights, faucets, AED, etc.

Snow Shovelers – This important volunteer team keeps our sidewalk safe for all ages: Preschool and Childcare Centers, Monday-Friday by 7 AM and weekend and weekday events. Boosts curb appeal letting the public know we are open for business.

St. Luke’s Preschool – This school year program has served families in our church and community for 52 years. A wonderful Christian environment that prepares children for Kindergarten.



Trunk or Treat is a community event. Members of St. Luke's and the community decorate their cars/trunks and pass out candy to the trick or treaters. We have S'mores, popcorn and cider by the campfire. It takes a small army to make it successful. It is always the Sunday prior to Halloween from 4:30-6 pm.

Yard Care Group keeps St. Luke’s exterior looking good throughout the growing season. Keeping the gardens watered, trimming the trees and shrubs and caring for the raingarden, saving St. Luke’s \$2,500/year.

Community Life Team - Though society might tell us that we can do life on our own, God's word tells us that we simply cannot function without others. (Read 1 Corinthians 12) We need each other and we need community, friends in Christ. All are Welcome!

Card Ministry Team meets at Church the 2nd Monday at 1 PM. About 40 hand-designed cards are sent out to home-bound or ill members. Each card has a personal message signed by the team.

Care Team serves our homebound, sick, or members going through a crisis. Members of this ministry make phone calls, visits and distribute communion to those who are unable to attend worship. Contact is made when it works best for the person. The smiles and hugs received from these members is the most wonderful part of this ministry and tells the story of how important it is to keep everyone connected to St. Luke's no matter what their circumstance.

Dishwashing Team members rotate Sunday mornings, volunteer for funerals, and other events. No experience necessary. Training provided.

Fall Fellowship happens on the Wednesday of MEA in October. Campfire, food, and games make for a delightful evening for everyone. We make sandwiches for the Sandwich Project

Family Game Night - The last Friday of each month, young and old gather to play games and share snacks. It is a great opportunity to invite a friend or neighbor to join you at St. Luke's for some fun and fellowship.

Men's Golf Team - Monday afternoons from May to September at Lost Spur Golf Course.

Men's Softball Team is all about fellowship and community building. Our team has been playing since 1988 against the same Church teams for years.

Sailing Ministry – Experience the transformation that occurs when you let the wind move you. The word for wind in Hebrew and Greek can also be translated as Spirit. St. Luke's invites you to enjoy time on the water of Lake Superior, sailing around and exploring the Apostle Islands. There is a High School Graduate Trip in the summer and an Adult Trip in the fall.



Spring Celebration – Like the Fall Festival, we make sandwiches and enjoy an outdoor picnic.

Sunday Hosts set up the coffee, water, and treats prior to the 8:30 worship. Partner with your friends.

Sunday Treats are provided by members each week. Schedule is flexible. Homemade and/or store bought. It's easier to connect while enjoying a beverage and treat.

Vacations with a Purpose – St. Luke's has participated in past trips to the Holy Lands and Greece. Along with adult trips, know that St. Luke's has a congregational approach to Youth Ministries. Adults are invited to be leaders on retreats, ski trips, sailing, and especially the summer youth mission trips. Sign up to be contacted for either or both of these adventures.

Wednesday Night Meal – A great combination of good food and faithful friends. Meal is from 5:30-6:00 PM in Fellowship Hall. Servant teams have a 5-week rotation. Teams prepare, serve meals, and clean up. Another member does all the shopping.



STEWARDSHIP

Stewardship Team seeks to lead members into spiritual formation that allows us to trust God, to serve God, and enjoy God with all we are and all we have. This is not just about money, it includes giving time and sharing talents. Below are ways for you to strengthen the church and your own life.

Attendance WELCOME CARDS are helpful in caring for our members. It allows us to follow up with those we have not heard or seen.

Bulletin Production is a time consuming project, especially for the Easter and Christmas worships.

Office Volunteer – Assist with projects, mailings, the phone, and greet those who come to the office. Be on call or have a set schedule.

Talents & Resources - What's your talent? St. Luke's invites those willing and able to share their talent with the congregation. See list on the back cover. This is by no means an exhaustive list, thus the opportunity to add an "Other?" item if not listed.

Teller Ministry work in pairs and rotating weeks. The tellers process the offering collections insuring members' donations are properly recorded and money is deposited into the bank in a timely fashion.

Household Budgeting – Three Tools

1. Financial Purpose "Be wise with money to live a life of contentment, confidence and generosity." Every dollar you have has a purpose. When you have a Biblical mindset with money you recognize your blessings and desire to share it with others in the name of the Lord. 3. LSS Financial Counseling is a nonprofit that offers quality guidance, knowledge and tools that empower individuals and families to achieve freedom from debt and financial worries, purchase a home and more.

b. PHASE Fund is specifically for youth providing scholarships and funding for special activities and events such as Camp and the Mission Trip.

c. Undesignated Gifts are used to support immediate unforeseen needs and repairs for the congregation.

Faith Formation Team – We believe that our faith is formed, and re-formed, through our entire lives. Faith Formation begins at birth, and is nourished by the family, with the assistance and support of the congregation and church leadership. At St. Luke's, you'll find Faith Formation activities for all ages.

Library Ministry includes the Little Free Library outside and in the hall behind the sanctuary. Help with display, book management and selection.

Milestone Ministry - All Ages!

A faith milestone is a marker along life's journey that says, " This is something important and God is here, too." Marking a milestone helps all generations recognize God's presence in all of life. Special activities and classes (milestones) are offered for each age/grade level throughout the year.

Women's Bible Study – Gathers during the school year Mondays at 9:00 AM.



SUNDAY MORNINGS – YEAR ROUND

Nursery is for a when child needs a little more wiggle room. Parents are invited to stay with their child and are welcome to use the nursery during all worships.

Prayground invites the littlest among us to experience worship up front in a space designed especially for them. Soft toys, books, and more are available, along with a Prayground attendant to help engage them.

Activity Bags filled with crayons, coloring pages, and books are available in the Narthex and outside the door near the pulpit.

Children's Message gathers in the front of the sanctuary to hear a message specifically geared for them. The rest of the congregation often participates.

Children's Church uses Godly Play which helps children explore faith through story, wonder and play. It is based on Montessori principles and, develops over time, using a spiral curriculum. Children are invited to go before the readings and return after the prayers.

Midweek Fellowship and Education

Community Meal is a great combination of good food and faithful friends. Meal is Wednesdays, 5:30-6:00 PM in Fellowship Hall. Suggested donation is \$3/person, \$10/family, and those 5 and under Free.

Preschooler and Parent Ministry (6:00-6:30 PM) Guided activities and play time help to foster friendships between the children and the parents.

Children's Ministry (6:00-7:00 PM) K-2nd grade students enjoy building relationships, and studying the Bible through fun and creative ways.

Upper Elementary Ministry (6:00-7:00 PM) 3rd-5th grade students begin to integrate their faith and life, through the Bible, Service, and Ministry opportunities.

Confirmation (6:00-7:00 PM) 6th-8th grade students rotates annually with learning the Bible, the Small Catechism, and Peer Ministry.

Adult Education (6:00-7:00 PM) Topical Studies from September – December. January – April is a Bible study following the Narrative Lectionary which is the Gospel of Mark in 2024.

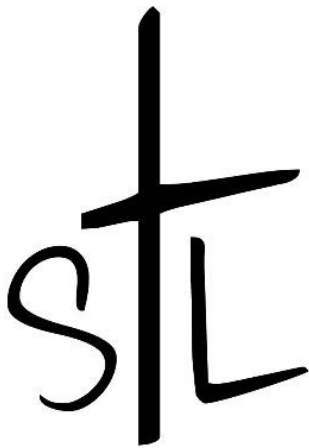
